May 14 - 27, 2010

Always wanted to see the wildebeest migration in the Serengeti - then this is your safari! This is classic Africa ... luxurious accommodation, incredible landscapes and abundant wildlife!

May 14/15: In Transit from Canada/US to Nairobi, Kenya via London or Amsterdam.

May 16 - Stanley Hotel, Nairobi - www.sarovahotels.com/stanley - (2 nights): Arrive early morning, transfer to the Stanley Hotel in Nairobi on a B&B basis. After getting a little refreshed, visit Giraffe Centre and Kazuri Beads! A welcome dinner and safari briefing in the evening.

May 17: Today we make a very special visit to Daphne Sheldrick's Elephant Orphanage! The afternoon is at leisure for optional tours, a visit to the museum or get some shopping in at a local market or stores. B



May 18/19 - Amboseli Serena Safari Lodge, Amboseli N.P, Kenya - www.serenahotels.com - (2 nights): We depart south with Mount Kilimanjaro looming to the east and along the way we stop at the Kajiado Girls School to spend some time with some special students. The next 2 days are spent exploring Amboseli National Park, one of the smallest parks in Kenya but with the highest population of elephants. Some really great lion sightings have been made here too! May 20 - Lake Manyara Serena, Lake Manyara, Tanzania - www.serenahotels.com - (2 nights): Say goodbye to Kenya as we head to the Namanga border to cross into Tanzania. Change over to our 4WD Land Rovers and head west to Lake Manyara watching the landscape change before your very eyes! Enjoy the colorful people you will meet along the way – especially the Maasai in their brightly colored kangas. Arrive at your luxurious lodge on the edge of the escarpment overlooking the Rift Valley in time for dinner and stargazing! B,L,D

May 21: Depart the lodge after a hearty breakfast and head down into the valley for a close up look at Lake Manyara National Park. This park has a very high elephant population and we may even get to see them having their daily play in Lake Manyara.

This is also a great park to see large numbers of giraffe, buffalo, and primates too, in fact, you should have a good sighting of Sykes Monkeys as well as Baboon and Vervet Monkeys. Return to the lodge for lunch and the afternoon off - or join in on an optional nature walk or mountain bike down into the rift valley - if not - the pool is absolutely beautiful!

May 22 - Ngorongoro Crater Serena Lodge - www.serenahotels.com - (1 night): After breakfast, we continue our journey to the world famous Ngorongoro Crater - one of the most unique wildlife viewing spectacles in Africa. Our lodge is built into the dormant volcano with the plant and ivy covered native stone blending with its surroundings.

Once at the lodge, we will quickly unpack- pick up our lunches and head down in the crater itself. The crater has a great diversity of ecosystems including a savanna and forest area. There is a constant source of water and food for the antelope and zebra so there is no need to migrate. This is also a prolific region to see prides of lion as well. Often there will be a breeding pair and you can watch the interactions between the handsome black-maned males and golden tawny females. If we are very lucky we will be privileged to see Black Rhino - we will surely be looking! Lunch will be picnic style while watching hippos spouting and snorting. Once back at the lodge, watch another incredible sunset from your lodge above the crater, then a delicious dinner and off to bed to get ready for the next days adventure.

May 23, 24 & 25 - Serengeti Serena, Serengeti National Park - www.serenahotels.com - (3 nights): We leave the Ngorongoro Crater and stop to visit a Maasai Village along the way. Ask many questions and take many pictures of these colorful and gentle people, they are eager to share their culture. Next stop is the Olduvai Gorge, taking in some natural history of the place believed where man was born. On to the Serengeti National Park, home to some of the most incredible wildlife and scenery. The next 2 full days will be spent game driving through the migrating wildebeest watching for lion, leopard, and cheetah! Your accommodation Drawing its inspiration from the circular 'Rondavel' dwellings and winding paths of a traditional Maasai village, the Lodge features thickly-thatched, stone-built rooms, spaciouly set amongst groves of indigenous trees that are cooled by sparkling streams and papyrus-fringed ponds. As for views, from lilac-streaked sunrise to diamond-domed night, the sensational Serengeti delivers a series of timeless volcanic vistas that are second to none.

CLIMATE - The climate of Kenya and Tanzania will be generally dry and sunny with day temperatures averaging 25°C. The evenings will be cool so a sweater or fleece will be in order. The rainy season has just ended so depending on what rain they did receive - expect to see some beautiful greenery too! The hottest time to visit this incredible country is in October when the daytime temperatures can creep into the mid 30's.
